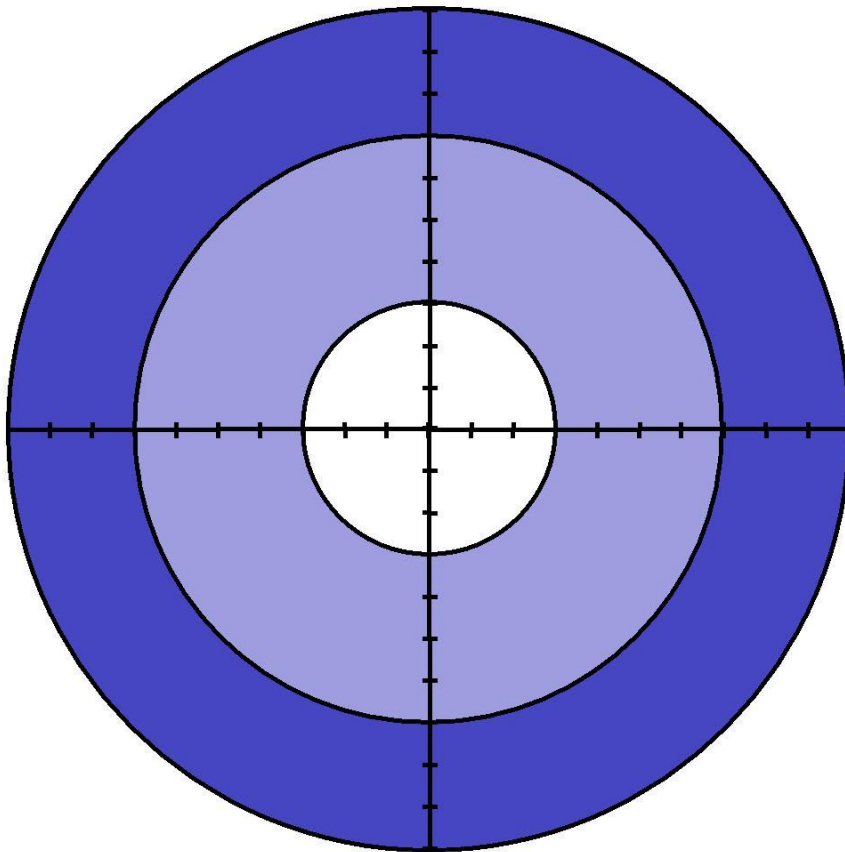

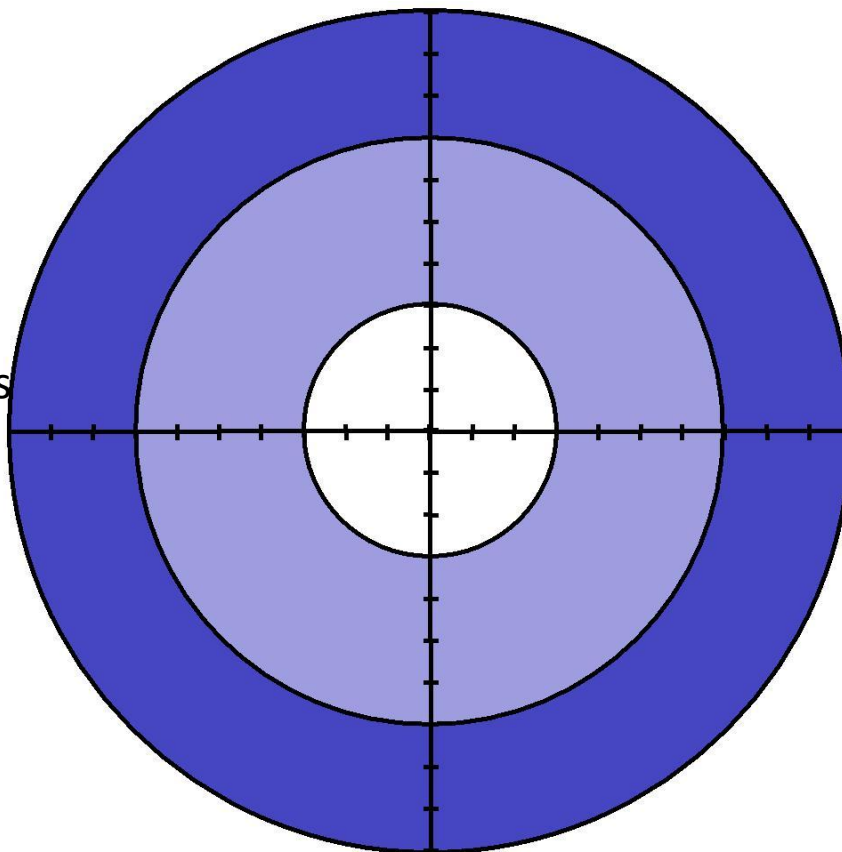

### Construct 1: Commitment to interprofessional collaboration (IPC)

**\*Actions:** Besides agreeing on a score, the dialogue is also about suggestions on actions, improvements and efforts for IPC/IPE. If any immediate ideas come up, the facilitator takes notes and the box is marked with a X.

When all the questions within the four constructs has been scored, you must mark a conclusive score for each construct on a line like the following and then draw all 4 results onto the compass-figure, so it makes a square. The wider the square, the better readiness 😊.
